


Distance: Approx. 4.3 km
Walking Time: Approx. 1 hour (without stops)



Diefenbaker Stamp Mural - Located on the side of the Willkommen Centre, this mural honours John G. Diefenbaker, Canada's 13th Prime Minister. It is a representation of an actual stamp which shows a Humboldt Post Office cancellation mark.

German Culture in Humboldt Area Mural - (on the side of Shopper's Drug Mart)
The balcony represents two generations of residents. Pioneer women wear traditional German clothes, and the former owners of Humboldt Pharmacy are hanging a banner.

Ford Dealership Mural - (on the side of Discovery Ford) Taken from an early photograph, this mural shows the old Ford Dealership, post office, and CIBC building. The 1923 Model T depicted is still used in parades and displayed at special events.

Humboldt's Beginnings Mural - (on the side of Tremblay Furniture) From left to right: teepees and the European explorers depict history prior to settlement, three men survey the area, the water tower represents the development of Humboldt.

Heritage Garden Park - Take a break and sit in this newly developed park and enjoy the scenery. Take a look at the beautifully decorated concrete benches and enjoy the view of the larger Civic Park just beside City Hall.

Humboldt Historical Park Campground - Take a walk through the campground, or stop to enjoy a round of mini-golf. The tourist booth houses information on local attractions, as well as a small gift-shop.

Water Ridge Park - Enjoy a relaxing break at the park's gazebo or picnic shelter, or take a leisurely stroll along the walking paths and enjoy the beautiful flower beds and developing trees.


Humboldt Historic Water Tower - Built in 1914-15, the water tower stands 95 feet high and is 25 feet in diameter. It is one of only four water towers remaining in the province.

Liquor Store Murals - The Humboldt Liquor Store is home to twelve murals, both inside and outside, depicting wine country, vineyards, processing, hops, beer-making, and then enjoyment.

Harvest Memories Mural - (on the side of Horizon Senior's Centre) This mural depicts old-fashioned farming. It shows an authentic binder and a man stoking hay. A mother and her little girl bring lunch to the against a backdrop of historical landmarks.

Alexander von Humboldt Bronze Bust - Just in front of the museum is the bust of Alexander von Humboldt, for whom our city is named. This bust was commissioned in honour of Alexander von Humboldt's 225th birth anniversary.

Humboldt & District Museum & Gallery - Finish your walk off with a tour of the 3-storey Humboldt Museum. Located in the old Post Office, the Museum houses a collection of Historical artifacts, as well as displaying the work of local artists.


