#### PUBLIC HEARING – BYLAW NO. 01/2006:

A delegation consisting of some of the residents on 12<sup>th</sup> Street were in attendance at the Public Hearing to express their opposition to the proposed rezoning of Lot 14, Block 19, Plan 4747 from R1-Residential District to R2-Residential District.

Spokesperson for the delegation, Mr. Leslie Sarauer presented City Council with a petition with 30 names of property owners in the neighbourhood. The petition listed the following reasons for their opposition to the rezoning:

- 1. The increased traffic flow from an apartment block in this location will be hazardous to neighbourhood children going to and from school.
- 2. The sewer system in this area is very old and may have difficulty handling an additional 4 families. Several homes on this block have had sewer backups in the last several years.
- 3. Parking will be a concern on this 50 foot lot.
- This area is currently zoned residential R1 single dwelling and on that premise there have been several new homes built on the street in the last few years.
- 5. An apartment block in this area will discourage new home construction and the revitalization of this older neighbourhood.

The Mayor asked the Works and Utilities Director whether the sewer system in that area could handle an additional four families. The Works and Utilities Director indicated that while the sewer main in that area is old, the line could handle an additional four families. The sewer service connections to the residents may need to be repaired and that could be the reason some home owners are experiencing sewer backups.

Mr. Darren Monz, developer and owner of the property was in attendance at the hearing. Mr. Monz presented Council with his proposed design of the 4-plex. The proposal allows for parking for 8 vehicles on the property. He explained that the proposed 4-plex would be a rental unit for seniors. Mr. Monz indicated he would be responsible to keep the back alley clear of snow in the winter.

The Mayor informed the delegation of the City's plans to review the City's Zoning Bylaw and Basic Planning Statement. This is being done in conjunction with Mr. John Wolfenburg, Consultant.

The delegation asked whether their taxes would decrease as they stated their property values would decrease with an apartment on their street. The City Manager indicated that in the short term it would be unlikely that any significant change to their property assessments would occur.

The delegation also stated that the proposed development did not allow for any green space and this would not be aesthetically pleasing to the neighbourhood.

Mr. Monz indicated that if the 4-plex would not be approved he did have a plan for a duplex. Mr. Monz was advised that duplexes are a permitted use in the R1-Residential District and that Council approval would not be required.

Mayor Korte thanked the delegation and Mr. Monz for attending the hearing. The delegation left the meeting at 7:55 p.m.
